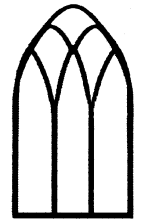

Journey to Jerusalem

Friends in Christ, every year before the Christian Passover we celebrate our redemption through the death and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ. Lent is a time to prepare for this celebration and to renew our life in the paschal mystery.

We begin our journey to Easter with the sign of ashes. This ancient sign speaks of the frailty and uncertainty of human life, and marks the penitence of this community. We thus begin this holy season by acknowledging our need for repentance, and for the mercy and forgiveness proclaimed in the gospel of Jesus Christ. This Ash Wednesday service will be on March 9 at 7 pm in our Sanctuary. We will pray, sing, and have time for quiet reflection.

You are invited to observe a holy Lent by self-examination and penitence, by prayer and fasting, by works of love, and by reading and meditating on the Word of God. It has been tradition to give something up for Lent, to make a sacrifice as a sign of drawing nearer to God. This Lent what if we all added something? What if we added acts of serving our neighbor or a daily Bible reading and prayer time? I know, I know, my life is already too full you say. I would bet that if you add a meaningful practice to your daily walk, you would find more clarity about how and where you spend time. Many of us have been doing this using the Pray Daily booklet and carving out a few minutes for prayer and reflection.

These forty days of Lent we mark Jesus' journey to Jerusalem where, "he humbled himself and became obedient to death — even death on a cross! Therefore God exalted him to the highest place and gave him the name that is above all names, that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father." (Phillipians 2:8-11) May we all draw closer to him!

Please come and join the women of Fort Hill celebrate over brunch at 10:30 am on Saturday, May 7, in Tartan Hall and hear our guest speaker, Beth Lindsay Templeton, as she talks about being a "Servant or Sucker". You'll also find out what a "cubcake" is!

Who is Beth Lindsay Templeton?

After 24 years of directing the non-profit United Ministries, Beth stepped down from the director's role to teach, preach, and write about the lessons she learned working for poverty alleviation. And so **Our Eyes were Opened** was born. In 2007, **Our Eyes Were Opened** was chartered as an affiliate of United Ministries, a registered 401(c)3 located in Greenville, SC. Our Eyes Were Opened has since educated over 8,000 people through their workshops, simulations, and Beth's book, **Loving Your Neighbor**. This organization offers interactive learning experiences to educators, community leaders, church organizations, college students, and corporations to help them become more aware of the needs and diversity of people who live in poverty. They offer tools that help their participants flesh out their understanding of poverty not only for occasions when they want to volunteer, but also through the contacts and opportunities that come up in their daily lives with friends, family, employees, clients, or panhandlers who are in need. **Our Eyes Were Opened** has already educated a variety of people about the realities of poverty, helping them to know where to start, how their gifts fit in and how to avoid burning our and getting burned! Where does yours fit in?? Come join us to find out.

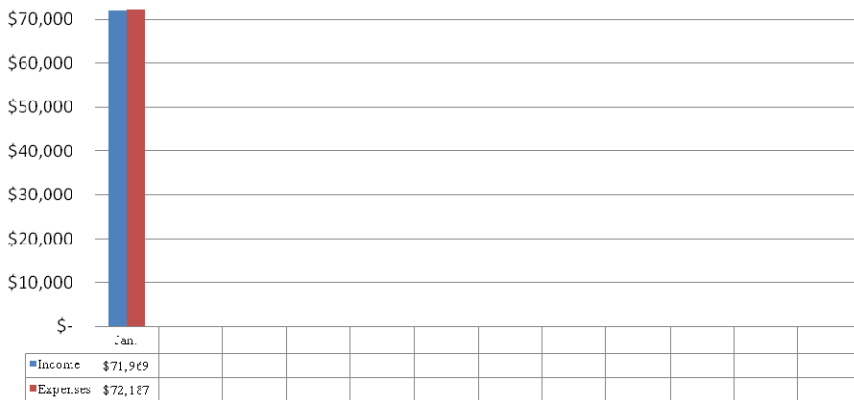
From the Finance Ministry

In January, the Session approved the 2011 budget. The budget includes a projected income of \$949,863, and planned expenses of \$966,886. This budget has a deficit of \$17,023. Session believes the deficit will be made up with the addition of new members in 2011.

Income for January was \$71,969, while expenses were \$72,187. The mortgage balance as of January 31, 2011 was \$262,222.

Approximately 18 payments remain until the mortgage will be paid off.

Troop 235 Eagle Court of Honor

Boy Scout Troop 235 in Clemson held its first Eagle Scout Court of Honor for the year on January 31, 2011. Two scouts from the Troop were awarded the rank of Eagle Scout. J. Ross Davis and Reid Andrew Pigeon were presented their Eagle Rank by Scoutmaster Vic Shelburne. These fine young men represent the 162nd and 163rd Eagle Scout Rank Awards presented to members of the troop since it was chartered in 1963.

Mr. Davis, son of Cynthia and Don Davis of Seneca, has earned 21 merit badges, completed a total of 121 nights camping, and contributed 90 service project hours to the community since joining the Troop in 2004. For his Eagle Scout Service Project, he led the troop in the renovation of the amphitheater at Old Stone Church in Clemson. Mr. Davis has participated in three high adventure trips with the troop including Philmont in New Mexico, Birchbank in Canada, and Florida's Sea Base.
