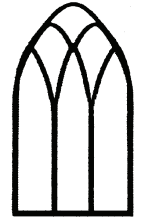

## Joining on a Journey of Faith...

This celebration is primarily Scottish-American. It is a time to reflect on Fort Hill Presbyterian Church's heritage. It is a time for reflection and thankfulness.

Come join in a renewed commitment to our church's goals. Be a Scot for a day. This will also be Reformation Sunday and a time to remember the Saints who have passed away this past year.



## InDwellings Update

Through our Christian Action Ministry, **Fort Hill** was the first church in the Presbytery to make a 3-year pledge to the InDwellings' Capital Campaign and I'd like to tell you about the progress InDwellings has made thus far. Since our kick-off in May 2009, the capital campaign committee members have met with 47 of the 67 churches in the Presbytery. The congregations range in size from 9 to 3,700. It takes many months between making the initial contact, setting a date, meeting with the mission/outreach committee or session, and then following up. As many as five presentations were given to smaller groups within some of the larger churches. We knew that last year was economically probably one of the **worst** times to kick off this effort, but are excited about the response.

The members of our board of directors and the capital campaign committee have pledged over \$54,000 alone. We have received a total of \$173,005.59 in gifts and uncollected pledges. One church offered to match any individual gifts made through their church by May 2, 2010 up to \$5,000. We were thrilled to receive a check for \$17,300. Many individuals contributed through that church by so noting on the memo line "InDwellings". We have also received a \$25,000 grant from the John I. Smith Foundation and have 20+ more grant applications in the works. This past week, we received two family foundation grants through a church, one for \$10,000 and the other for \$5,000. Our honorary campaign chairman,

Michael Cogdill, news anchor on WYFF 4 in Greenville, is committed to speaking on our behalf as he believes in this effort so strongly. He spoke in all three services to the largest Presbyterian congregation this past May.

The children's giving jar at St. Giles brought \$81.57 and the VBS at Piedmont and Fountain Inn used InDwellings as a mission project as well. A sweet wonderful note and check from the Mid High group at Trinity Presbyterian in Travelers Rest arrived two weeks ago. They did local mission work this summer and held a "Carnival of Caring" with games, food, and live music. They raised almost \$300, which was matched by the church and their PW added another \$100 bringing their total gift to \$682! We also recently received a check from United Way of Anderson.

I receive the list of all the donations that come in to send acknowledgements. Some of the smallest churches have given so much that it reminds me of the story in Mark about the widow's mite. Please pray for our efforts as we continue to be an advocate for families with adult children that are developmentally challenged. ## PSA News

We gave away t-shirts to students during the first week of classes that feature the Life is Good® character "Jake" hiking along, smiling and toting a "Clemson orange" backpack, while highlighting key points from a familiar Micah 6 verse: "Do Justice; Love Kindness; Walk Humbly with God." These words again appear on the stickers we give to students, this time subtly mimicking the shape of tread on the soles of a pair of work boots. These images of foot-to-earth travel remind our students that faith is a journey, and at times is challenging and uncomfortable — but is a road that we do not travel alone.



This year, our programs focus on exploring and defining what Jesus and Paul say it means to be a disciple of Christ, which of course means being a servant of God and engaging our whole lives as we move toward that purpose. Referring to the context of Micah 6:6-8, the three statements of this year's "PSA gear" remind us that our call is both a simple and an extensive one. What God requires of us is not only to profess belief, or go to church, or be nice to each other; we must work toward an active life of faith and discipleship that goes beyond ourselves and the walls we inhabit. We challenge our students to not get too comfortable and sedentary within their environment, but to seek out opportunities to love God and love their neighbors. This may mean being intentional about welcoming new students so that they feel like part of the family right away, using their leadership roles to build up others, or cheerfully serving in the community. Through student-led mission teams, "freshman connectors," and even intramural sports, our students take initiative to invest in being part of God's kingdom as it is here on earth by living their lives as disciples of Christ.

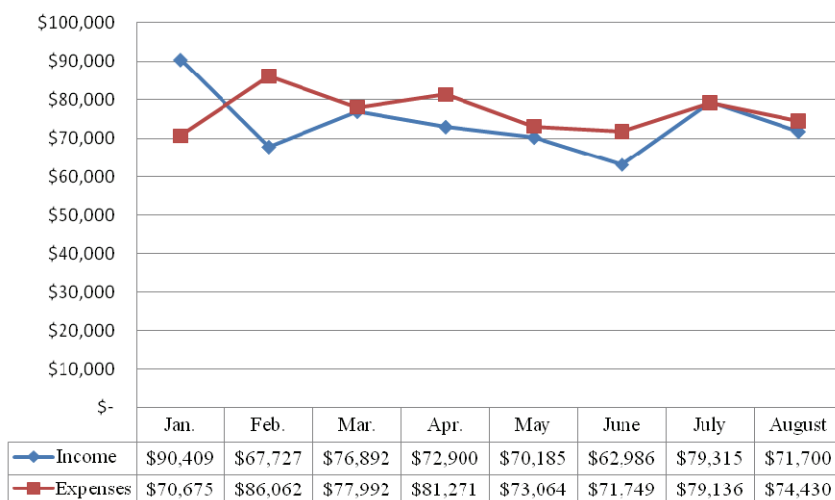


## From the Finance Ministry

Through August, General Fund income was \$580,198.75 (63% of budget) while total expenses were \$608,419.77 (66% of budget) leaving a deficit of \$28,221.02. Income continues to be behind expenses. 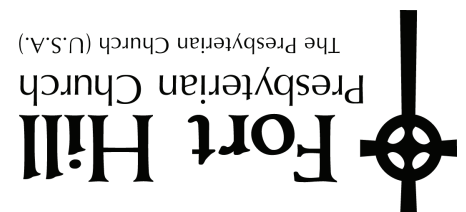
## **NEW TRI-FOLD FLYER ABOUT PRESBYTERIAN WOMEN**
